Dear Ms. Peterson,

Thank you for your letter of February 25 indicating interest in re-establishing a working relationship between our institutions.

The articulation agreement between our two colleges is still in effect. We currently list Northwestern in our pre-chiropractic program brochure as one of the chiropractic colleges with which we have preferred seating arrangements (brochure and catalog are enclosed). Students are advised of these arrangements. Also the new CCE social science and humanities admission requirements of 15 credit hours that went into effect in the Fall of 1991 are now incorporated into our pre-chiropractic program. These are not listed in the articulation agreement since it was developed in 1989. We may want to amend the agreement to include these.

I am the Pre-chiropractic Program Coordinator and, as part of my duties, I advise all of the pre-chiropractic students. Currently there are over 80 students in the program. I am also the faculty advisor to the Pre-chiropractic Club. If you would like to visit Bloomfield and meet with students, arrangements should be made through me. It is not uncommon for recruiters from the various chiropractic colleges to spend an afternoon on campus. Some have coordinated their trip to Bloomfield to coincide with the New Jersey State Chiropractic Society Convention if they have a booth there.

I would appreciate if you could send me a current catalog from Northwestern, a videotape of the college and application materials. I have catalogs, videotapes and applications from the chiropractic colleges in my office which are made available to the students.

I look forward to hearing from you and to re-establishing the working relationship between our colleges.

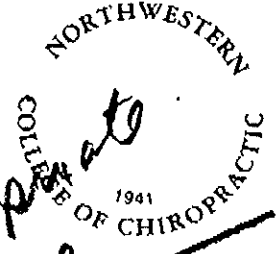

WHEREAS, The NORTHWESTERN COLLEGE OF CHIROPRACTIC, located in Bloomington, Minnesota and BLOOMFIELD COLLEGE, Bloomfield, New Jersey, mutually wish to assist students seeking admission to NORTHWESTERN COLLEGE OF CHIROPRACTIC to prepare for careers in chiropractic health care; and,

WHEREAS, certain requirements must be met prior to admission including completion of specific prerequisite courses; and,

WHEREAS, identification of such courses will aid future students, assist counselors in their advisement role and conserve time and effort;

IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED that the NORTHWESTERN COLLEGE OF CHIROPRACTIC and BLOOMFIELD COLLEGE mutually agree that the specific courses and other information shown on the Attachment, will be honored for the time period as shown.

IT IS FURTHER AGREED that completion of courses enumerated in this Agreement does not guarantee admission but does constitute a significant step toward it.

This Agreement, upon approval, shall supersede all prior agreements.

ARTICULATION AGREEMENT  
AGREEMENT WITH BLOOMFIELD COLLEGE**

Students who are considering NORTHWESTERN COLLEGE OF CHIROPRACTIC for completion of the Doctor of Chiropractic degree are advised to consult with a counselor at NORTHWESTERN COLLEGE OF CHIROPRACTIC COLLEGE, in person or by telephone, about other requirements not shown herein. The College telephone number is (612) 888-4777.

NORTHWESTERN COLLEGE OF CHIROPRACTIC offers a program equivalent to five academic years completed in 3-1/3 calendar years. Applicants for preferential admissions<sup>#</sup> must have completed a minimum of 60 semester units leading to a baccalaureate degree in the arts or sciences with a cumulative grade point average of at least 2.50 (on a 4.0 scale). Science courses must be taken in sequential order and must include laboratories. Only 20 credits can be CLEP excluding science and laboratory courses. The following course prerequisites must be completed with a grade of "C" or better.\*

\*Basic requirements are set by the Council on Chiropractic Education, the accrediting agency for chiropractic education, recognized by the U.S. Department of Education. Northwestern College of Chiropractic is an accredited Chiropractic College in the United States.

#Preferential admission of Bloomfield College students to Northwestern College of Chiropractic requires a supportive recommendation from the Health Professions Advisor of Bloomfield College

This agreement shall become effective when signed and exchanged by representative of both institutions.
