

NWHSU/WITCC TRANSFER AGREEMENT

This Agreement is entered into between Northwestern Health Sciences University (NWHSU) and Western Iowa Tech Community College (WITCC) and applies to the Associate of Science in Sports Medicine degree program offered by Western Iowa Tech Community College.

This agreement is applicable to health sciences degree programs as listed in Table 2, and Western Iowa Tech Community College's the Associate of Science in Sports Medicine degree program as outlined in Table 1. This agreement will facilitate credit transfer and provide a smooth transition from one related program to another.

It is mutually agreed upon:

Admission and Graduation Requirements

- A. NWHSU admission and program admission requirements apply equally to both direct entry students and to students who transfer under this agreement.
- B. Students accepted into NWHSU must fulfill the baccalaureate program graduation requirements.

Transfer of Credits

- A. NWHSU will accept 71 credits from WITCC to apply to a related health sciences baccalaureate degree program.
- B. All college courses in Associate of Science in Sports Medicine degree program transfer and count toward the selected NWHSU baccalaureate degree program requirements. In the event a course can only transfer and count as an elective, students must not be required to complete more than 120 credits.
- C. Baccalaureate health sciences degree programs may have limited enrollment capacity with seats available on a competitive basis. Completion of the Associate of Science in Sports Medicine degree program does not guarantee admission to a baccalaureate program.
- D. Table 1 lists the classes required classes for the Associate of Science in Sports Medicine at WITCC and the transfer equivalent classes at NWHSU.

Terms of Agreement

- A. This Articulation Agreement is effective on 8/5/14, and shall remain in effect unless terminated or amended by either party with 90 days prior written notice. This Articulation Agreement will be reviewed by all parties within five years of the effective date, on or before 8/5/19.
- B. The Chief Academic Officers or designees of the parties to this agreement will implement the terms of this agreement, including identifying and incorporating any changes into subsequent agreements, assuring compliance with system policy, procedure and guidelines, and conducting a periodic review of this agreement.
- C. Program curriculum and requirements may change as agreed by all parties.
- D. This Agreement and any amendments and supplements shall be interpreted pursuant to the laws of the State of Minnesota.

This agreement is committed to articulation within the field of health sciences and the parties in the agreement share a belief that health care practice is best expressed in terms of learner outcomes rather than inputs and process measures. We acknowledge a common core of knowledge that increases in breadth, depth, and scope of practice as one chooses to progress along the educational continuum. This agreement is designed to advance a shared commitment to providing opportunities for health sciences educational mobility without undue loss of credit.

APPLICABLE PROGRAMS

To complete a health sciences baccalaureate degree program, credits from the Health Sciences, AS degree program will transfer to university programs listed below according to terms of this agreement.



